

Kettlewell with Starbotton Parish Council

Meeting held on 7 February 2018 at 7.30pm in Kettlewell Village Hall

Present: Cllr Harvey (chairman and minutes), Cllr Appleton, Cllr Lister, County Cllr Quinn and 7 members of the public

Apologies: Cllr Spillett (at work) and District Cllr Graham (at a Council meeting).

1 Declaration of interest

There were no declarations of interest.

2 Minutes of the last meeting

It was resolved that the minutes of the meeting of 16 December 2017 were a true and accurate record.

3 Planning Matters

- a. C/46/116P and C/46/116Q/LB Scargill House. Phil Stone and Dave Lucas from The Scargill Movement spoke to the meeting about their proposed plans. The plans had not differed much from the last draft two years ago. The work is as before due to be rolled out over a fifteen year time scale.
- b. C/46/48J The Old Sheep Dip, Kettlewell. Counsellors agreed to have a site visit on 9 February. At that site meeting Cllrs Harvey, Lister and Appleton agreed to no objections, but with more clarity and on the existing rights of way through the property on the plans and concerns that the parking bays on the plans may impact on the rights of way.

Planning matters to note:

- c. C/46/196B Damside Cottage, Kettlewell – Full planning permission for the replacement of concrete paving flags to front elevation with Yorkstone flags- conditionally approved.
- d. C/46/196C/LB Damside Cottage, Kettlewell – Listed building consent for re-ordering of cottage interior and replacement of concrete paving flags to front elevation with Yorkstone flags – conditionally approved.
- e. Trees in Kettlewell conservation area notification to reduce the size of two cherry trees and on holly at Kettlewell village Hall – for information.

4 Reports

- a. North Yorkshire Police – PC Lee Britton introduced PC Emily Hewitson to the meeting. From next week one or other of them will be working our area. PC Hewitson reported the crime figures from last year to the meeting. Crime reports have increased in Starbotton but decreased in Kettlewell.
- b. North Yorkshire County Council - Cllr G Quinn reported that not much is happening right now that can be reported on. Cllr Quinn will be attending the

Craven Area Committee and asked the council for issues to be raised. The council gave Cllr Quinn many highways matters to be raised.

- c. Craven District Council – no report.

5 Street lighting update:

Mr Wilkinson reported that all lights were on. Cllr Harvey asked on behalf of the new owners of the Fox and Hounds in Starbotton that their long redundant street light be mended.

6 Accounts

- a. On 24 January, Barclays Business Saver £8,531 and Community Account £3.40.
- b. The council agreed to pay £184.90 for a new battery and pads for the Kettlewell defibrillator. (which may reduce to £54.90 as the battery is not old). The Councillors resolved to pay the Kettlewell Village Hall £90 for room hire.

Cllr Harvey agreed to email the YDNP and ask why.
